

Provider Blood Lead Testing Report Card

- New York State requires health care providers to test all children for lead with a blood lead test at age 1 year and again at age 2 years, to assess a child's risk of lead exposure at each well-child visit, and to perform lead testing if a child is found to be at risk. (10NYCRR 67-1.2)
- Medicaid requires that all children who are enrolled received a blood lead test at both 1 and 2 years of age. If no lead test has been completed, children should receive a test between 3 and 5 years of age.
- Capillary blood lead samples with a result of 5 µg/dL or greater require a confirmatory venous sample analyzed by a lab approved for toxicology blood lead comprehensive testing* within 3 months or less, depending on the initial capillary blood lead sample result.
- ALL capillary blood lead results obtained in a provider's office from a point-of-care device (i.e. LeadCarell®) must be reported to the New York State Department of Health.




Your Testing Rate vs. NYS vs. NYS Medicaid
