



Introduction

In the spring of 2022 the Clinton County Health Department (CCHD) surveyed Clinton County residents to provide perspective about community health. Residents were asked to identify features of a strong, vibrant, healthy community; for their opinions on health, social and environmental challenges in the community; to identify health and social challenges and any barriers to medical care experienced by themselves or a family member within the past year; and, for demographic information about individual respondents and their households. The summary below outlines what respondents who indicated they reside in the Town of Beekmantown identified as features, challenges or barriers and highlights how they compare to the responses of all Clinton County respondents.

Findings

A total of 1,081 responses were received from Clinton County residents. Eighty-one (81) of the respondents indicated they reside in the Town of Beekmantown.

Demographics of Survey Respondents

The overall demographics of survey respondents who reside in Beekmantown varied slightly from those of Clinton County respondents overall. Four-fifths of survey respondents (80.25%) identified as female and 14.81% of respondents identified as male (4.94% of respondents chose not to answer this question). In regards to age, the majority of respondents were ages 25-44 (49.33%), followed by ages 45-64 (40.74%), ages 65-79 (4.94%), 80 years and older (3.70%) and ages 18-24 (1.23%). There were no responses from individuals age 17 and younger. The vast majority of respondents (98.77%) indicated that the primary language spoken in their household was English, however one respondent (1.23%) indicated that Italian was the primary language spoken in their home. Almost ninety-four percent of respondents reported their race/ethnicity as white, while two respondents (2.47%) identified as American Indian. Asian/Pacific Islander, Black/African American and Hispanic, Latino or Spanish origin each had one (1.23%) respondent select them. The highest level of education completed by survey respondents was diverse; 1.23% completed some high school but did not finish; 19.75% obtained a high school diploma or GED; 22.22% completed some college or obtained a technical or trade school certificate, or an Associate's degree; 27.16% obtained a Bachelor's degree' and 28.40% a Master's degree or higher. The household annual income reported by respondents also varied; 7.41% reported a household annual income of less than \$24,999; 20.99% reported \$25,000-\$49,000; 32.10% reported \$50,000-\$99,999; and 29.63% reported \$100,000 or more. The majority of respondents are employed full-time (70.37%), part-time (9.88%), or retired (8.64%). When asked if they had a primary care provider (PCP), 87.65% indicated they were being followed by a PCP, while 12.35% indicated they were not (almost 3 percentage points higher than all Clinton County respondents). The breakdown for all respondents' responses to demographic questions can be found in Table 1.

Definition of a Healthy Community

When asked whether they believed they live in a healthy community, 27.16% of respondents agreed or strongly agreed that they live in a healthy community. One-quarter (24.69%) of respondents disagreed or strongly disagreed with this statement, while 48.15% of respondents felt neutral toward this statement. Respondents were then asked to identify features of a strong, vibrant, healthy community. The top features reported by residents were health care services (37.04%); livable wages (37.04%); clean environment (29.63%); mental health services (28.40%); good schools (27.16%); and a safe environment (27.16%). The features ranked lowest by Beekmantown residents were transportation (3.70%); diverse populations (4.94%); and equality (4.94%). When compared to county responses, Beekmantown residents were more likely to select mental health services (12 percentage points) and less likely to select affordable housing (10 percentage points) as top features. See Figure 1 for perceptions of living in a healthy community by residents and Figure 2 for the top features of a strong, vibrant, healthy community.

Health Challenges of Concern and Experienced

Beekmantown residents identified access to mental health services (48.15%); substance abuse (46.91%); mental health (45.68%); access to health care services (33.33%); chronic disease (30.86%); and overweight/obesity (30.86%) as the top health related challenges of concern in the community. More than 87% of respondents reported that they or a family member experienced one or more health challenge in the past year. The top challenges reported were mental health (46.48%); overweight/obesity (35.21%); access to mental health services (33.08%); access to health care specialists (28.17%); and access to dental care (26.76%).

Almost half (46.91%) of respondents identified substance abuse as a health challenge in the community, while just over 14% of respondents reported that they or a family member experienced it as a health challenge within the past year. Similarly, 33.33% of respondents identified access to health care services as a challenge in the community, though only 18% of them reported they or a family member had trouble accessing health care services within the past year. Additionally, almost 50% of respondents reported that they or a family member experienced mental challenges in the past year. Over 60% of respondents reported they or a family member experienced at least one barrier to receiving medical care in the past year. The barriers reported most frequently by Beekmantown respondents included: no specialist appointment was available (32.65%), co-pays or deductibles were too high (24.49%), could not leave work/school (24.49%), could not afford (22.45%), and did not accept my insurance (22.45%). Social Challenges of Concern and Experienced

Town of Beekmantown residents identified the same top three social challenges in the community as all Clinton County residents surveyed, lack of a livable wage (45.68%), affordable housing (30.86%), and access to healthy foods (30.86%). The fourth and fifth-ranked social challenges in the community were identified as child abuse/neglect (25.93%) and domestic violence (24.69%), though only 1.79% and 3.57% of respondents reported they or a family member experienced those challenges in the past year,

respectively. Almost 70% of respondents reported they or a family member experienced at least one social challenge in the past year. Almost one-third (30.86%) of respondents identified access to healthy food as a social concern in the community, though just under 15% of respondents or their family members had trouble accessing healthy foods within the past year. Social challenges experienced most often by Beekmantown residents or their family members in the past year included lack of livable wage (44.64%), lack of support or resources for youth (25.00%), opportunities for physical activity (23.21%), and childcare (21.43%). Environmental Concerns


More than half (56.79%) of residents identified aging infrastructure as a top environmental concern in the community. Beekmantown residents were more likely to select school safety (44.44%) and waste disposal or recycling (40.74%) than county residents (33.33% and 30.19% respectively). More than one-third of respondents (38.27%) identified drinking water quality as a top environmental concern, while 37.04% selected stream, river, lake quality. See *Figure 7* for environmental concerns among respondents from the Town of Beekmantown.

Self- Perceived Physical and Mental Health

The majority of respondents self-reported their physical health as good (44.44%) or average (40.74%). Only 6.17% reported their physical health as poor or extremely poor and 8.64% reported their physical health as excellent. A similar pattern in responses was seen for self-reported mental health with 87.65% of respondents reporting their mental health as average, good or excellent; 11.11% of respondents reported their mental health as poor, and 1.23% respondents reported their mental health as extremely poor.
