## How much time do I have to spend volunteering?

To be a CCMRC volunteer you must complete an initial core training. Trainings are offered both in person and online and include *Incident Command Systems (ICS)*, *HIPPA*, and *Psychological First Aid*.

As a volunteer you also have the option to receive additional trainings throughout the year, including: CPR, Personal Preparedness, and advanced ICS courses.

Volunteers can choose to be a part of community outreach and education efforts, emergency response, or both depending on their interest.

## What do CCMRC volunteers do?

CCMRC volunteers help local emergency and public health workers in a variety of settings, including:

- Large health emergencies,
- Public outreach activities,
- Health Department Drills and Trainings,
- Vaccine clinics.

Interested volunteers may also assist with the operation and deployment of other volunteers.
